SUPPLY LIST

WATERCOLOR: Professional grade watercolor tubes: Permanent Red, New Gamboge, Sap Green, Ultramarine Blue, Cerulean Blue, Burnt Sienna.

Palette with a lid (for easy transport), Brushes for watercolor, #10 round, #3 round and a 1" flat.

Watercolor paper, either one sheet (22x30) or a pad of watercolor paper....#140 lb. Will also be used for Gouache. Water resistant surface to support your paper....ie, a piece of cardboard approx. 9 x 12, covered with freezer paper, shiny side out.

Masking tape 1" wide., roll of paper towels

Sketch book and #2 pencil, kneaded eraser. A cup for water.

GOUACHE: You can get a set of gouache at either Michaels or Hobby Lobby. I think it is about \$10 for a set of 12 colors. Use your coupon from the paper or online.

You can use the same brushes as you do for watercolor and you will probably want a Liner or Rigger, about a #2.

Palette. You can get a handy little palette by purchasing a 16-color set of Crayola watercolors (about \$4). Take the plastic wells out of the palette and with pressure from the back, the Crayola paint will pop out, leaving a good little palette with plenty of room for your Gouache paints and a mixing area. This will also work for your watercolors and it is easy to carry.

FLUID ACRYLICS: I will provide what paint and thinner that is needed for \$14.00 per person. If you already have them, great.

Brushes: you will need a soft bristle brushes for acrylic. ... a 1" flat, and a #10 round. A small palette knife will also be handy.

Canvases: Several 8 x 10 canvases, either boards or stretched canvas. Michael's often has them on sale, a 10-pack of stretched canvas for \$20.00.

A pad of Palette Paper for mixing.

Handy things to include....an apron or smock, plastic gloves.
